Dear Landing Team Members,

We are writing to ask the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to begin the process of formally withdrawing, in its entirety, the Horse Protection Amendments final rule, published in the Federal Register on May 8, 2024, portions of which are scheduled to become effective on February 1, 2025, and to explore any and all available options, including delayed implementation of enforcement of the entire rule.

As agricultural leaders, including the Commissioners, Directors, and Secretaries of the various State Departments of Agriculture, we know firsthand the importance of protecting the equine industry and these animals. However, we must do so with practical and enforceable regulations.

If implemented, the new HPA rule would devastate the equine community, especially breeders, trainers, and horse owners nationwide. Agriculture and its related industries need policies that are helpful rather than harmful.

Excessive regulation, unwarranted government expansion, unnecessary expenses, and burdens will negatively impact the industry and the economy. Your action in this matter is crucial for sustaining the economic vitality of our national equine industry.
